Introduction to KidWorks Deluxe			
Objective			
Students will participate in a demonstration of KidWorks Deluxe. Students will practice using KidWorks Deluxe to complete a simple activity			
Materials			
Equipment in elab, Kidworks deluxe activity sheet – one per computer, sample of KidWorks Deluxe booklet, teacher directions for activity			
Before the lesson			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Run copies of activity sheet 1 per computer (3 Pages) ○ Open KidWorks Deluxe on all computers- May need to change to 256 colors to get it to run. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To Change to 256 colors <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Right click on an empty part of the screen Click Settings Click on the down arrow next to 16-bit High Color Click on 256 colors If message pops up to keep settings click Yes Click apply → ok <p>To change back, follow the steps and change to 16-bit high color</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Set up White board in e110 – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To set up white board – turn on computer next to desk Turn on projector Use the keyboard and mouse to login as usual When computer come up, doubleclick on Ibid icon- should get a message letting you know if white board and computer are connected Minimize Ibid screen 			
During the Lesson			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Seat students on floor in front of the screen ➤ Show them the Kidworks Deluxe icon <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Explain that today they will learn about KidWorks Deluxe. It lets them type words and sentences and draw or paint pictures to go with their story. When they are finished, it prints out like a book ○ Tell them, we're going to go through an activity to show us how to use KidWorks and if there is time, they will practice on the computer ➤ Double-click on the icon so the students will see what happens when it opens. ➤ From there, follow the directions on the activity sheet. (I used Weston's name in the directions, you can follow that if you want or select a child from the class you're working with so that they can see how they will log in to their class) ➤ I've included a teacher directions set to help with dialog and things to pull out while you're going through the demo. ➤ If time permits, have the students go to the computers and practice the activity themselves. 			

You can use your directions from the demo to guide them through as they do it on their own.

Option: Students can print out their books if paper is not an issue.

After the Lesson

Make sure computers are back to login screen so that you are ready for the next class.
